

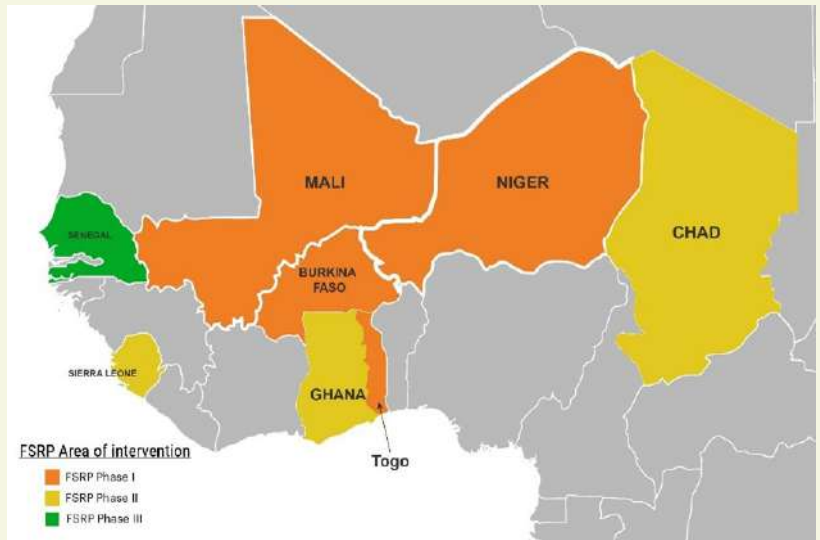


WEST AFRICA FOOD SYSTEM RESILIENCE PROGRAM

FSRP Development Objective

To combat food insecurity and strengthen the resilience of food systems in participating countries, eight (8) of which are currently participating.

Regional activities are coordinated by ECOWAS, CILSS and CORAF through three (3) key areas of intervention: (i) Digital advisory services for the prevention and management of agricultural and food crises; (ii) Sustainability and adaptability of the productive base of the food system; (iii) Integration and trade of regional food markets.



SOME KEY ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2023



Number of beneficiaries reached in countries and at regional level



1 221 751 direct beneficiaries, 37% of whom are women out of a final target of **5 million**, 40% of whom are women.



Digital advisory services for the prevention and management of agricultural and food crises (AGRHYMET/CILSS Regional Center)



More than **654 000** actors of the food system, **17% of** them are **women**, had easy access to hydro and agrometeorological advisory services.



Sustainability and adaptability of the food system's production base (CORAF)



▪ **41 technologies** disseminated,

▪ **More than 311,208 farmers (36% women)** have adopted climate-smart agricultural technologies and services,



▪ **22 081 hectares of land** under Integrated Landscape Management (ILM) technologies.

Integration and trade of regional food markets (ECOWAS)



76 private sector actors involved in regional trade were supported,



▪ **3124 women farmers** have benefited from services to improve marketing in the FSRP's priority value chains.
